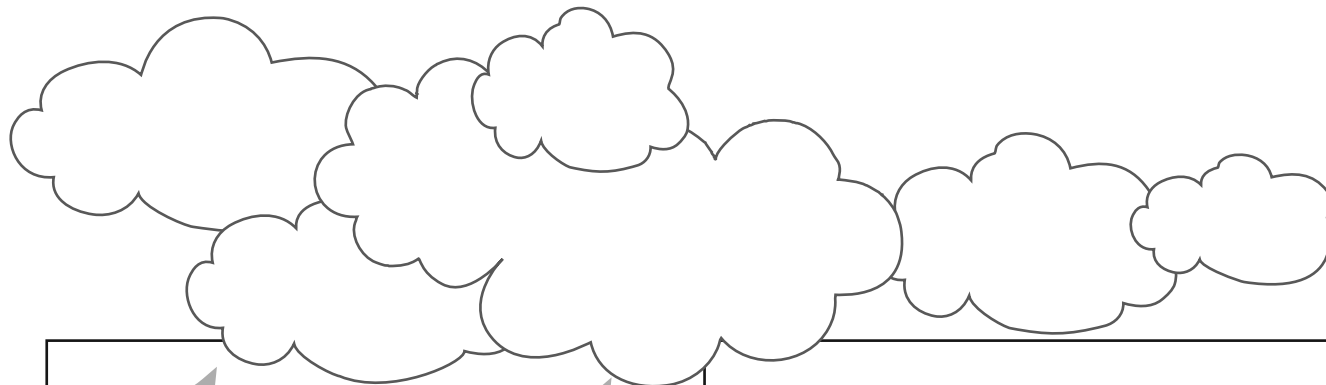
SUMMER STORMS • WEATHER GRAPH

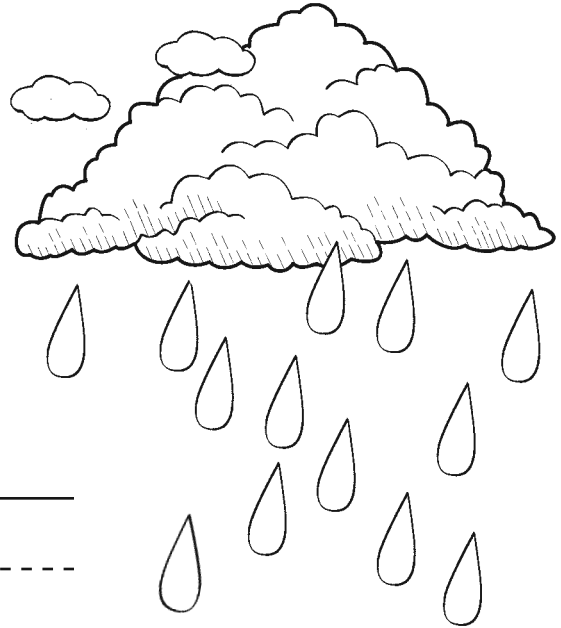
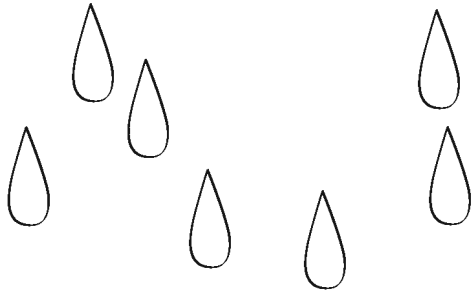

Hurricanes usually do the most damage in the North Atlantic Ocean, the Gulf of Mexico, and the Caribbean Sea. Hurricanes that form in the Pacific rarely hit land, but strong Atlantic hurricanes strike the Caribbean Islands, Mexico, and the American



South every year. The word “hurricane” comes from the Caribe Indian word for an evil spirit, “huracan.” A hurricane releases the same amount of energy as dropping a nuclear bomb every twenty minutes.
