#### **Noun Definition**

A noun is a word that names something, such as a person, place, thing, or idea.

#### Nouns Examples:



PERSON brother, lawyer, classmate, Chris

PLACE Spain, city, bedroom, school

ANIMAL dog, monkey, cat, bird

THING pencil, bag, cellphone, car,

IDEA justice, freedom, love

#### Proper Vs Common Nouns



A proper noun is a specific name of a person, place, or thing, and is <u>always capitalized.</u>

Examples: England, Kelly, The Sun

A common noun is the generic name of an item and is not capitalized (unless it's at the beginning of a sentence or in a title.)

Examples: pencil, river, bike

### Singular vs Plural Nouns



When you are talking about one thing, a singular noun is used.

Example: pencil, tree, bike

When you are talking about more than one thing, a plural noun is used.

Example: pencils, trees, bikes

#### Plural Noun Rules



# Let's look at how to change a singular noun into a plural noun....



To make regular nouns plural, add -s to the end.









one cup



three cups

If the singular noun ends in -s, -ss, -sh, -ch, -x, or -z, add -es to the end to make it plural.









one bus

two buses

If a singular noun ends in -y and the letter before the -y is a consonant, change the ending to -ies to make the noun plural.



one puppy



two puppies



one bunny



two bunnies



If the singular noun ends in -o, add -es to make it plural.



one tomato



three tomatoes



one volcano



two volcanoes



## Some nouns don't change at all when they're pluralized.







two sheep



one deer



two deer



Nouns that are irregular, don't follow any particular rules.







two mice



one child



two children
